PPRD East Programme

Phase 1 - duration:

December 2010 – September 2014

Funding: EUR 6 M

Phase 2 - duration:

December 2014 – November 2018

extended till May 2019

Funding: EUR 5,5 M

Purposes:

- √ to strengthen Partner Countries' civil protection capacities for disaster prevention, preparedness and response
- √ to strengthen regional cooperation and bring the Partner Countries progressively closer to the EU Civil Protection Mechanism





HNS Table-top Exercise

Lead-in scenario:

- territory of Armenia affected by serious disaster
- Government requested international assistance
- several states participating in UCPM deployed assisting teams

NEED to resolve provision of assistance to the coming international teams in:

- border crossing
- customs clearance
- accreditation of specific professions (medical, etc.)
- acceptance of drugs
- veterinary services
- allocation of space for the establishment of camps
- provision of fuel
- escort to disaster affected areas and security
- legal and liability aspects, etc.







HNS Table-top Exercise

Conclusions:

 the existing institutional and legislative frameworks provides sufficient basis for reception of international teams

Recommendations:

- the HNS concept needs to be promulgated to all institutions
- need to develop a single legal document to:
- identify the responsibilities of all relevant ministries and institutions
- cover not only earthquake situations
- HNS Country Team should be established and trained regularly

Exercise Objectives

- to verify and improve procedures, to establish a common understanding of cooperation in civil protection assistance interventions and to accelerate/improve the response in major emergencies;
- to provide learning opportunities for all participants involved in assistance interventions related to the work of the Union Civil Protection Mechanism (including the implementation of EU Host Nation Support Guidelines);
- to enhance operational cooperation and coordination among the intervention teams;







Exercise Objectives continued

- to test the provision and receipt of civil protection assistance via the Mechanism (including communication and coordination with the Emergency Response Coordination Centre (ERCC) of the European Commission) using HNS guidelines and templates;
- to enhance the interoperability of equipment, command/coordination structures, procedures and communication tools from Partner Countries and the EU capabilities;
- to enhance the common understanding and implementation of main principles provided by the international guidelines and handbooks used during emergencies and international deployments.

- Coordination
- Communication
- Host Nation Support







Scenario

The scenario had 3 major incidents: an **earthquake** causing the collapse of buildings and breach of a dam resulting **in flooding**. A simultaneous traffic accident and the accident in the chemical factory caused the release of **dangerous chemicals in the atmosphere**.

Link between Regional TTX and Field Exercise

- Same disaster scenario
- TTX was at the level of decision makers
- Moldova sent request of assistance to the ERCC
- ERCC distributed request and coordinated responses
- PCs responded with offers of assistance
- PCs and Moldova negotiated HNS
 - > TIME BREAK
- The Field Exercise started the day after the TTX ends

Challenges

- Czech Republic, Denmark, Romania, Belarus, Ukraine:
 - Transport by road, border crossing, transit country assistance
- Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia:
 - Transport by air, cargo limitations
 - Need HNS for local transport and accommodation
 - Need HNS for equipment (e.g. compressed air cylinders)

- > Team Trainers and safety advisor (PPRD East 2 NKEs)
- > EUCPT proposed by EUCPM PS, nominated by DG **ECHO**
- > Evaluators proposed by EUCPM PS, selected by

Full-scale Field Exercise

Team Trainers

- assisted each PC during Regional TTX, providing introduction to the TTX, clarification whenever needed, and feed back after the TTX
- provided feed-back to teams during Field Exercise

Evaluators

provided written evaluations of the achievement of the exercise objectives

Observers

 visited OSOCC, LEMA, and observed selected activities






